Behavioral Economics studies the area between economics and psychology. It is based on the theory that people do not always act rationally and that human behavior influences decision-making in financial markets.

Behavioral Economics is usually explained using so-called biases, such as mental accounting, loss aversion, framing, confirmation bias and anchoring. Some of the most important economists in the field of behavioral Finance are Daniel Kahnemann, Richard Thaler, Werner de Bondt and Robert Schiller.
